GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTION

Mission statement

The College was established by the Govt. of Mizoram as the premier science college to cater to the need for science education among the predominantly ST students of Mizoram which is located in a remote corner of North East India, sandwiched between Bangladesh and Myanmar. Since there are very few institutions in the State that offer courses in science, the College has been instituted to fill this void.

Goals

The principle goal is to cater to the need for higher learning in the college level in various fields of science education in Mizoram. It is envisaged that the knowledge and skills gained from the institution, with the degree obtained, would *facilitate students for future employment opportunities*. It strives to produce students who are responsible citizens equipped with educated information in science which would be utilized for the development of the State as well as the Nation.

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SECTION –I

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Government Zirtiri Residential Science College was born out of the rising demand for a purely Science College which the State had so far been bereft of. The ever increasing thirst for scientific knowledge coupled with the pressure put on the Government by the Science Teachers' Association of Mizoram and Mizoram College Teachers' Association has led to the conversion of the erstwhile Government Zirtiri Women's College into Govt. Zirtiri Residential Science College. Realising the needs and aspirations of the people and inspired by the vision of achieving scientific and technological proficiency, the College began functioning in the year 2000. The existing Home Science Department of Zirtiri Women's College was amalgamated with the Science faculties from other Government Colleges of the State. It became a co-educational institute and has occupied the status of being the only Science College in Mizoram and the only College in the State to offer the study of Home Science. The College has been accredited with a B Grade (CGPA 2.22) by NAAC in the first accreditation cycle in 2009.

Situated at a location which is far from the din and noise of the city, the institution provides a tranquil atmosphere which is so essential for quality education. The College is staffed with a team of highly qualified and experienced teaching faculty who are committed to the development and enlightening of their students under the motto '**Lighted to Lighten**'.

The college has adequately served its purpose to meet the needs and demands of the students of Mizoram which, inspite of high literacy percentage, still lags behind in the field of science and technology. Since students have been going out of the state to pursue higher studies in science education, a sizeable amount of time and resource is spent for the purpose. As such, this College has taken the initiative to provide more choices and chances to students who cannot afford to join Colleges outside the state.

CURRICULA

The College follows the curricula prescribed by Mizoram University to which it is affiliated. The college offers three streams of studies viz. Science, Home Science and Computer Science. Students can opt for core subjects like Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Home Science. Electronics, Geology and Biochemistry are ancillary courses available. It is the only college under Mizoram University to offer a course in Home Science. Computer Science (BCA) was introduced from the Academic Session 2003 with initial funding from North Eastern Council. Students are taken to study tours and trips as per prescribed in the syllabi.

ADMISSION AND EXAMINATION

Admission into the College is done purely on merit basis. The cut-off mark is generally 45% in the concerned subject. Written test with interview may be conducted for particular course of study depending upon the number of qualified candidates.

With the introduction of the semester system in 2011, atleast two internal examinations are conducted every semester which carries 25% marks in every subject. Besides class tests and examinations, students are regularly tasked with Home Assignments and are encouraged to engage in group discussions and seminars. Assessments are made from these activities. The College lays emphasis on the attendance of the students. As per the University norms, students are compelled to attend at least 75% of class lectures. To ensure that students comply with this norm, monthly attendance of each student is accounted and displayed on notice boards.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students actively participate in varied extension activities like blood donation, awareness drives, outreach & visit programmes. The NSS units of the college are extremely active in community service. Teachers and students are active members of NGO's like the Y.M.A., Science Societies, Rotary Club, etc. Every year the Students Union organize annual sports in which all students are expected to take active part. Inter-College sports meet organized by the Mizoram University is another annual event in which the college has been an active

participant. Students have bagged prizes in inter-college competitions like quiz, debate, essay writing, etc. The Evangelical Union of the college holds weekly prayer meetings and annual functions to nourish the spiritual and moral life of the students. The 'Senhri Cultural Club' of the college has also been performing in and outside the state.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The infrastructure of the college consists of two multi-storied buildings, one of which is used for administrative purpose with theory classes, and the other for practical classes. The college has a Library, an auditorium, two Home Science Labs, six Science Labs, a Computer Lab, Language Lab, students' recreation/common room, S.U Rooms and a canteen.

College Library

The College Library is located at the entrance of the main building. The Library is well maintained and has a rich stock of books, journals, magazines and other periodicals. Open self-system gives the students easy access to books. It is backed-up with UGC Network Resource Centre which was established with funding from UGC-NERO. A number of computers were installed with broadband internet connection. The library books were technically classified using 'Dewey Decimal Classification' system (22nd edition).

The College has a Library Committee which is mainly concerned with regulating the process of collecting books, documents and relevant journals like Scientific American, Current Science, Resonance, Digit, Computers Today, Indian Journal of Medical Research, Indian Journal of Chemistry 'A', Indian Journal of Biochemistry & Biophysics, Medicinal and Aromatic Plant Abstracts, etc. The Library Committee offers suggestions for the improvement of the library from time to time. CCTVs have been installed in the library to ensure safe keeping. Since May 2011, SOUL 2.0 (unlimited version) from INFLIBNET (Ahmedabad) was used for computerization of the College Library. The system is used for charging and discharging materials to users. The library also provides reprographic and lamination services at rates lower than market rates. Orientation programmes are organized for new students to acquaint them with the rules and functions

Computer Laboratory

Well-equipped computer labs are available for the students with branded core i3 processors and overhead computer projectors. All the computers are connected via LAN, which provides a networked environment. The lab contains all necessary software, and audio-visual teaching aids to impart effective teaching. Broadband Internet facility is also available free of cost so that students can have access to unlimited wealth of information on the net. A System Assistant is employed on contract basis who is responsible for maintaining the computers.

Language Lab

A modernized language lab is housed in the computer lab. Internationally acclaimed language software is installed in the lab. Audio visual hardwares are available for teaching along with the system.

RESEARCH SPECIFIC FACILITIES

(a) DBT Institutional Bio-tech Hub

Since 2012, Biotech Hub has been established with funding from the Dept. Biotechnology (New Delhi). The Hub has been established to serve as a platform for teaching and undertaking research. Hands-on training and teaching are given to students as well as faculty members on the latest techniques in biotechnology. A number of outreach programs have been conducted for Higher Secondary School students. The Hub is functioning smoothly and is being used for research works by teachers and also for conducting practical classes. Facilities of the Biotech Hub include PCR Machine, UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, High Speed Centrifuge, Gel Electrophoresis kits, etc. and several accessories for conducting basic routine experiments.

(b) Radiation Monitoring Lab

A laboratory for monitoring natural background radiation from the environment has been established in this institution through the Research Project

funded by Board of research in Nuclear Sciences (BRNS), Govt. of India since 2008. Radionuclides which occur in nature like uranium, radium, potassium, sodium and their daughter products like radon, thoron gases from the terrestrial origins are monitored. At the same time, Gamma radiations originating from cosmic as well as terrestrial sources are also monitored. Some of these radionuclides have adverse effect on human health and are known to cause various diseases like lung cancer, skin diseases, etc. In the light of detection and monitoring the amount of concentration of these radioactive substances, the laboratory plays a very important role in quantification of these elements, determining the type of radioactive elements, their energies and concentrations in the environment.

This laboratory is equipped with highly sophisticated machines like NaI (TI) gamma spectrometer with 1k Multichannel Analyser, RAD7 and other nuclear track detecting instrument. Post Graduate students from University and Research Scholars doing their Ph.D. courses utilize the facilities and some of them have acquired Ph.D. degree from this lab. BRNS has a plan to upgrade this laboratory by providing research funds to this institution and install machines like laser fluorometry, scintillation Radon/thoron Monitor (SRM/STM) which will be used for detection and quantification of radionuclides present in the soil, rock and water.

(c) IERMON Centre

Environmental Assessment Division of Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Mumbai has developed solar powered Environmental Radiation Monitor (ERM) for keeping an eye on radiation level in the environment, round the clock. This system is designed and developed for open field installation with wireless data communication using Short Message Service (SMS) of GSM Cellular Network, powered by solar panel with battery backup.

The system has been deployed at various locations in India covering Nuclear Power Plant sites (NPPs), uranium mining sites, Metro cities and other important locations under the Indian Environmental Radiation Monitoring Network (IERMON). The college is one of the few IERMON Centers that transmit background environmental radiation data to a central station at Mumbai. It will serve as an early warning system in case of a nuclear emergency leading to increased gamma radiation levels in the environment.

The nuclear emergency incidence is not a common occasion but when it happen, it could be fatal and usually affects a very large region, for example, when

Fukushima Nuclear Accident happened in March 12, 2011, not only in Japan, but the neighbouring countries like China, USA, etc. were being warned of the possible radiation cloud that could migrate in the air causing radiation hazards. There were lots of nuclear hoax all over the world that the spread of radiation could affect anywhere in the neighbouring countries, and it could also come to India where the route could also include Mizoram. After that incidence, the authority of the institution contacted Environmental Assessment Division of Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Mumbai to install this radiation monitoring system in the college. The EAD, BARC also readily accepted the request and the system was installed in June 16th 2011. The system has provided the status of Gamma radiation level of Aizawl round the clock and sends the data to IERMON central station at BARC, Mumbai.

STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

Each year, since its inception, many students of the College have passed the University Examinations with flying colours. There have been students who have ranked amongst the top ten in the University exams. Certificates and cash incentives were awarded to meritorious students. With sustained efforts put in by the teaching staff, many students have successfully moved on to higher studies. There have also been a sizeable number of past students who have successfully cleared prestigious examinations such as IIT entrance exam, NET (UGC) and other competitive exams organized by Mizoram Public Service Commission. Past students of the college are now placed at dignified positions in various departments and institutes.

Career & Counseling Cell looks after training and placement of students wherever openings are available. The Department of Computer Science is specifically concerned with placement of students in various jobs and opportunities. Student-feedback and Mentoring systems have been introduced in order to assist students, strengthen teacher-student relations, and fortify the amicable environment that exists in the College. Other student-welfare oriented initiatives are taken up by various Committees constituted under the UGC merged schemes (see below).

Students Union (SU): An active Students Union under the chairmanship of the Principal directly caters to the welfare of students. The SU organizes

competitions and other recreational functions like Freshers' Day, College Week, Graduation Day, Annual Prom events, etc. Annual elections are held among students to spearhead the SU movement.

UGC MERGED SCHEMES IN THE COLLEGE

1. **Career Counseling & Placement Cell:** The cell has been organizing campus exams for students of the final semester BCA. A good number of our students have been chosen to work in local Computer firms. The cell is collaborating with more such firms to find placement for our students. Further, career counseling classes are held at regular intervals for all the three streams, where eminent Resource persons were invited to deliver lectures. In collaboration with the Coaching for Entry into Services Cell, the final year students of all streams were made to undergo a PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT programme.
2. **Coaching for Entry into Service:** In collaboration with the Career Counseling Cell, Seminars were organized to motivate students and help them join both State and Central Services. The Cell also collaborated with STUDY FORUM, a leading Coaching Centre to provide coaching classes for several competitive exams. The Cell has also associated itself with the Sainik Welfare & Resettlement Directorate to help students join the Indian Army. The Cell has also been organising a Month-long coaching Class for those desiring to enter into Civil services. As mentioned above, PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT programmes are conducted for the final year students every year.
3. **Remedial Classes:** Remedial Classes are held on various subjects at the beginning of the Academic Session. The Lecturers of the college work extra hours outside the regular routine to provide special assistance to the students.
4. **UGC Network Resource Centre:** The Cell has purchased a number of computers and placed them at the College Library for use by the faculty and the students. Internet Facilities have also been provided to help students in their search for study materials.
5. **College with Relatively Higher Proportion of ST/SC/OBC:** A Committee has been formed to administer the fund received from UGC scheme. It is responsible for selection of eligible students for awarding of cash incentives

to meritorious students and also financial assistance to economically backward students under the schemes.

ORGANISATION AND MANAGEMENT:

The college is staffed with ~~4~~ Professor & Associate Professors (regular), ~~8~~ Assistant Professor (Contract) and ~~6~~ Assistant Professors (Part-time). There are 18 non-teaching staff including support staff that look after the laboratories. All these personnel constantly make an effort towards the improvement of the college. The Principal frequently interacts with the teaching and non-teaching staff in order to meet their individual as well as group needs and requirements. Meetings are held frequently for teaching and non-teaching staff to establish a congenial working condition amongst. Different sub-committees have been formed to look after various fields of the College Management. At the beginning of each academic year, a review committee is held on the performances and achievements of the College. Students as well as teachers take active part in social activities during natural calamities. Some of the committees instituted are:-

- a) Admission Committee
- b) Examination Committee
- c) Building Committee
- d) Internal Quality Assurance Cell.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

Since inception, the College has introduced National Service Scheme (NSS) which actively executes its activities throughout the year. It has made lots of contributions towards the welfare of the people of Mizoram in various fields like Tree Plantation, Awareness Campaign on HIV/AIDS, Cleanliness, Environment and Voluntary Blood Donation. They are actively involved in creating assets for the community like Waiting Sheds, Water Sheds and Public Urinals.

They visit different orphanages every year like Motherless Baby Home run by Salvation Army, Hermon Children's Home run by Zoram Evangelical Union (ZEF) and Hmangaihna In which is managed by Presbyterian Church etc.

The NSS volunteers help them by cleaning their compound and also donated food items and clothes to the inmates.

RED RIBBON CLUB:

The Red Ribbon Club of the college, with the 2 Nodal Officers and peer educators chosen from the student population, functions in close proximity with the NSS unit in its endeavor to spread HIV/AIDS awareness among the college students. Blood donation camps are usually held in collaboration with NSS. The Club also organizes Debates, Essay-writing competitions and slogan writing competitions to create awareness among the students. The Club aims at harnessing the potential of the youths by equipping them with correct attitude and information on mental health, substance abuse, nutrition and reproduction including sexual health.

HEALTHY PRACTICES

This college follows a number of healthy practices. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell(IQAC), constituted in 2011 has taken several steps for the enhancement of quality in every sphere of the college life.

(a) **Students' Feedback System:** The IQAC has introduced the 'Students' Feedback System' whereby students are asked to provide a feedback on their teachers through a common feedback form. This step has been taken to promote self-reflection and improvement on the part of the teachers. The exercise is usually done during even-semesters.

(b) **Mentoring System:** The College has also introduced the class guide and monitor system, with the ultimate aim of improving the work culture of our students and to create more contact hours between teachers and students. In this system, students are divided into groups and placed under a teacher who acts as their mentor and guide in all academic matters.

(c) **Invited Lectures:** Experts are invited to deliver lectures/training on soft skills, career prospects, and various other life skill aspects.

(d) **Consultancy Services:** Teachers are available to render their expertise and service to the community as well as government bodies. Expertise ranges from preparation of syllabi, food preparation, environment, health problems related to radiation exposure, etc.

(e) **Incentive Awards & Financial Assistance:** The College practiced waiver of fees as well as facilitating installment payment options to financially disadvantaged students. Teachers are willing and have contributed monthly financial support to those students who are found deserving. Incentive awards are also given to meritorious students from such contributions.

(f) **Seminars:** A seminar Committee has been established to sharpen intellectual skills and update academic capacity of students and teachers. A number of seminars, panel discussions, lectures, etc. have been conducted. The committee notifies and encourages the culture of class-wise seminars, college as well as state-level seminars.

(g) **Personality Development Programme for Outgoing Students:** The College conducts the programme in order to prepare outgoing students to depart from the college with confidence and poise. Various topics like use of IT, SoftSkill, manners and etiquettes, travel tips, resume writing, interview skills, etc. are taught.

LOOKING INTO THE FUTURE

In order that the college functions as a full fledged Residential Science College, a new site is being developed by the state government which will accommodate Administrative and Academic Blocks, Library, Hostels and staff Quarters. It is envisaged that the college will soon function as one of the leading science colleges of the country.

COLLEGE WEBSITE

SECTION-II

A. RULES OF DISCIPLINE IN CLASS ROOMS AND LABORATORIES

1. LATE ARRIVAL

Late arrival into Classrooms/Laboratories is a breach of discipline. A student will not be allowed to enter the Classroom/Laboratory 15 minutes after classes have commenced.

2. CLASS TEST/INTERNAL EXAMS

- (a) All students are expected to appear in class tests and other internal examinations.
- (b) All students must submit Laboratory Records and Assignments on time. Failure to turn in such works is a breach of College Rules and is punishable.

3. ATTENDANCE MATTER

- (a) All students are expected to be regular in attendance
- (b) A student must fulfill 75% monthly attendance failing which Parents/Guardians will have to meet the Principal.

4. MATTER REGARDING ABSENCE AND LEAVE

- (a) Staying away from College without proper leave will not be tolerated, except when the case is sudden illness or unforeseen circumstance.
- (b) After an absence from College, students must submit a letter of absence to the Principal duly signed by Parents/Guardians.

(c) Application for leave on Medical ground should be supported by authentic medical documents.

(d) Unauthorised absence from College at a stretch for a period exceeding 15 days may result in the student having his/her name removed off the rolls and may not be re-admitted.

5. MATTERS RELATING TO ATTENDANCE BY PROXY

Tendering one's attendance through proxy is a serious breach of discipline. The punishment of guilty student is as follows:

(a) For every single offence, the attendance given through proxy plus three previous classes attended of the concerned students will be summarily cancelled.

(b) Students acting as proxy and found marking attendance of classmates will have three class attendance records cancelled from the total attendance.

GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. SMOKING

Smoking is strictly prohibited within the College premises and is punishable with a fine of Rs. 200 (Rupees two hundred).

2. DRINKING:

Drinking of any liquor with alcohol content and taking other intoxicants is prohibited within the College campus and during College functions (College Week, Inter-College Sports and other functions). Students found guilty of such prohibited acts are punishable by suspension from College for a period not exceeding one month. Such students will be prohibited from attending all other College activities/functions. All kinds of unruly behaviour, whether as an outcome of drinking alcohol or not, is strictly prohibited. Habitual offenders will be expelled from College.

3. CELL PHONES

Active use of Cell-phone/ Ipods/ Music Players during lecture classes and practical classes is not allowed. Anyone found misusing such gadgets and indulging in such acts will have the material confiscated and parents will have to collect the same, with a fine, from the Principal.

4. DRESS CODE

All students are expected to come to College in decent costumes. Proper haircuts/hairstyles must be maintained by all students in and around the campus.

5. RESPECTING TEACHERS

Students are expected to show respect to all teachers regardless of whether they are directly taught by them or not. Stern action will be taken against students who are disrespectful to teachers in words or in actions.

All students of Govt. Zirtiri Residential Science College are compelled to abide by the Rules mentioned above. All malpractices and disobedience of the above-mentioned Rules will be recorded in the book of ADVERSE RECORD to be maintained by the Principal and names of offenders will be put up on the College notice board.

LIBRARY RULES

1. **LIBRARY TIMING :** 10:00 A.M.- 4:00 P.M. on all working days
2. **MEMBERS :** The Following are members of Govt. Zirtiri Residential Science College Library:
 - (1) All Teaching & Non-teaching Staff
 - (2) All regular students of the College.

3. GENERAL RULES:

- (i) Books/Documents are the property of Govt. Zirtiri Residential Science College.
- (ii) The member shall not sub-lend the books issued from the library.
- (iii) Reference books, rare books, unbound periodicals, newspapers may not be issued generally except with the permission of the Librarian.
- (iv) If the book borrowed is lost or damaged the borrower shall have to replace it in kind or shall have to pay a fine, double the price of the book.
- (v) If books are not returned on due date, there is an overdue charge @ Re. 1/- per day.
- (vi) The Librarian may recall any book from any member at anytime.
- (vii) Circulation Counter (Charging and Discharging) will close at 3:00 P.M.
- (viii) The readers should maintain silence in the Library.
- (ix) Use of Mobile phone is not allowed within the Library premises.
- (x) Library Attendant at the entrance is authorised to search a person if he/she is suspected of carrying any unauthorised documents from/into the Library.

4. TEACHING STAFF:

- (i) The College Teaching Staff is allowed to borrow 10 (ten) books at a time for six months.
- (ii) All the books must be returned on or before due date.

5. STUDENTS:

- (i) All personal belongings must be deposited at the property counter.
- (ii) Pets, foods and drinks should not be brought inside the Library.
- (iii) Library I.D. should be issued to every student.
- (iv) 2 (two) books can be issued to every student for 15 (fifteen) days. Renewal will not be done.
- (v) All the books/documents and Library I.D. must be returned before the end of academic session. Otherwise, examination marksheet, TC/PC will not be issued.
- (vi) In case of loss of Library I.D. a duplicate may be issued for which a fee of Rs. 50/- will have to be paid.
- (vii) Students are allowed to access internet free of cost.
- (viii) Students should use the internet only for collection of study materials.

6. NON-TEACHING STAFF AND OTHERS:

Non- Teaching Staff are allowed to borrow 3 (three) books at a time for 30 days. Others who would like to borrow documents from the library should deposit a sum of Rs. 1000/-

These Library Rules may be altered or amended or new rules may be added to the existing ones by the Librarian from time to time.
